National Victims of Crime Awareness Week (VOCAW) is held each year in April. The goal of VOCAW is to raise awareness about issues facing victims of crime and the services, programs and laws in place to help victims and their families. This year Victims of Crime Awareness Week will take place from April 19 to 25, 2015. The theme is *“Shaping the Future Together.”*

A & O will be hosting a free event on Tuesday, April 21st from 10am to 3pm at Landmark Cinemas, Grant Park Shopping Centre (1120 Grant Avenue). The goal is to improve access to victim services and supports by educating individuals who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing about community supports and to provide an opportunity to discuss existing barriers. This event will include presentations and exhibitor booths, followed by a question and answer period.

“Staying Safe: For the Deaf & Hard of Hearing” is offered in partnership with Manitoba Justice, Deaf Centre Manitoba Inc., Canadian Hard of Hearing Association, Manitoba Deaf Association, Society for Manitobans with Disabilities, Seniors & Healthy Aging Secretariat, Winnipeg Police Services and ECCOE.

This is a free all day event, lunch and refreshments will be provided. American Sign Language (ASL) services are available throughout the day and efforts will be made to provide Real Time Captioning. The day is open to anyone in the Deaf and Hard of Hearing communities, as well as service providers, family members, volunteers, and students. For more information please contact A & O.
