Unit: Hand Washing

Objective

Ps will identify the importance of hand washing to prevent illnesses

Materials

- Large flashcard Hand Washing
- The Store worksheet
- Bob's Day worksheet
- Sickness on your Hand worksheet
- Germs on your Hand worksheet
- Clean Hand worksheet
- Mini Flashcards
- Proper Hand Washing page

Step 1 Warm Up (5 minutes)

Hand Washing:

- Hold up the large flashcard of hand washing. Ask them "What is this?" If they don't know tell them wash hands.
- Ask someone "Do you wash your hands?" Ask everyone, "Do you wash your hands?"
- Point to yourself and then the flashcard and say "I wash my hands."
- Get them to repeat several times wash hands demonstrate "washing" and "hands" separately by showing the washing motion when you say wash and holding up your hands when you say hands.

Step 2 Work out (30 minutes)

Teaching why hand washing is important:

- Hand out the worksheet "Bob's Day" and talk about what he does that day.
- He takes the bus.
- He shakes someone's hand.
- He works on a computer.





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- He shops for fruit.
- He gives money
- Say "Oh no! Problem!" Repeat all that Bob does again but each time show how your hands are used – touching seat on bus, shaking hands, keyboard, picking up fruit, handing money.
- Look at your hands and fingers and point to them and say "Problem".
- Show **The Store**. Explain how a man coughed on fruit and then Bob came and touched the fruit.
- Show "Germs on Your Hands" Point out all the places Bob had been that day is on his hands.
- Refer back to **The Store** and point out once again how Bob got those germs on his hands.
- Show the "Sickness on your Hands" and talk about the different sicknesses he has on his hands.
- Say "problem" again.
- Be sure they understand the connection between touching different places (and getting germs on your hands) can lead to different illnesses.
- Show the large flashcard of hand washing again and explain if you wash hands there
 are no germs on your hands. Show the Clean Hand flashcard. Compare it to the
 "Sickness on your Hands" flashcard.
- Demonstrate how to wash your hands. (This can be with imaginary soap and water but even more beneficial if you can bring a bar of soap or even go to a sink area)
 Demonstrate how you wash all over – fingers, fingernails, knuckles, wrists. Demonstrate how it should be for at least 20 seconds – sing Happy Birthday while you do it to show the length.
- Demonstrate a lousy hand wash, no soap, very quick, and say "no" and "problem" to show the difference.
- Hand out "Proper Hand Washing" and go over together.
- Use the mini flashcards to demonstrate when you should wash your hands. For
 example put the mini flashcards of the girl hugging a dog, the germs on your hand, the
 washing your hand, and the clean hands in that order on the board. Show them when
 you hug a dog you should wash your hands

Step 3 Cool Down (10 minutes)

Check their progress:

- Put the students in pairs and give them each some mini flashcards that they can put in the correct order an activity that makes hands dirty, germs on the hands, wash the hands, clean hands and have them put it in the right order.
- Have them demonstrate how to wash their hands.
