“**Anyone**” is used to ask questions. It means one person or another.

Is anyone hurt?

“**Someone**” means one person. The speaker doesn’t say the person’s name. It is used with affirmative statements and to answer questions.

Yes, someone is hurt.

“**No one**” is used to answer questions with negative statements. It means no person.

No, no one is hurt.
