




		What it's called	What it means
		<b>Telemarketing Scams</b>	The scammer says you have won a prize and in order to receive the prize you have to give money or personal information to the caller.
		<b>Email scams</b>	Scammers promote fraud through junk emails, known as spam. Sometimes these emails get through your spam filter and look real. Be careful!
		<b>Tech support scam</b>	Scammer says they are calling from Windows or Microsoft and that they have found a virus in your computer. You allow them to access your computer and scammer takes it over and accesses all your personal info.
		<b>Phishing</b>	Sending emails and texts that look like they are from real companies in order to get you to reveal personal information, such as passwords and credit card numbers.
		<b>Mail scams</b>	Similar to email scams, but these come in the mail ('snail mail')
		<b>Door-to-door scams</b>	Con-artists try to get older adults to buy unnecessary products or services.
